## Loved

"But God showed His great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners." Romans 5:8 NLT

Inside of every teen girl is a desire to be loved. But love can be a confusing word due to the variety of ways we use it in our culture today. I love french fries. I love music. I love my family. The constant use of this word dulls it's value. When girls hear or read, "God loves you" is that the same as loving pizza or going to the beach? No, not at all. It's not even close to the same kind of love.

The Bible says God loves you so much that He sent Jesus to die while you were still a sinner (Roams 5:8). Would you die for someone? Maybe...just maybe you'd be willing to die for a handful of people you love who love you back. But what about rude neighbor, the man who just stole your grandmas purse or the girl spreading terrible rumors about you?

Let this truth soak in - God sent His Son to die for everyone! He sent His Son to die for you. Not because you are good or deserving...simply because He loves you. His love is a sacrificial kind of love and it's the love your teen girl heart craves. As you study and memorize this week's *Know by Heart* memory verse think about the value of God's sacrifice of love. It's a vastly different type of love than your desire for a pepperoni pizza!

BACKGROUND

Paul sent a letter ahead of his arrival in Rome to the Christian churches. His message reads more like a statement of faith rather than a typical letter. Paul reminds them, *all* are sinners in need of a Savior and one day God will judge sin. The law (though good) could not conquer sin...only Jesus's death on the cross and ressurection saves sinners.




